## Lagonglong SAAD fisherfolk reaps over 1T of Tilapia

AGONGLONG, Misamis Oriental (Jan. 08)- The Fishermen's Association of Kauswagan (FAK) celebrated a remarkable achievement by generating a substantial income of P130-K from itsinitial harvest of two ponds, made possible under the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic ResourcesRegion 10's (BFAR-10) Special Area for Agricultural Development (SAAD) Program.





The said fisherfolk association beneficiary is the first group of beneficiaries who reaped abountiful harvest of 543 kilograms of fresh cultured tilapia, translating into an estimated revenue P61-K. Simultaneously, the second group yielded 588 kilograms of tilapia, resulting in anapproximate income of over P68-K. These impressive outcomes underscore the success of the tilapia culture in ponds covering a500sqM area, initially stocked with 2,750 fingerlings and sold at a farm gate price of P120 perkilogram.

The proud fisherfolk beneficiaries showcased their achievements during the 94th foundinganniversary of Misamis Oriental, demonstrating the fruitful results of their dedicated efforts.Looking ahead, the remaining ponds are scheduled for harvest in the third week of February2024, with an expected yield of 2,000 kilograms and estimated earnings of around P240-K.
